

Now is the time for students to begin applying for scholarship support for 2019-2020. Wright State has an [online application](#) that all students – incoming, continuing, and transfer – can access to apply for multiple scholarships at once. Many college-level scholarships are allocated through this process and last year the **COLA Scholarship Committee** awarded over \$75,000 in support to more than 50 students. The deadline for this application is January 8, 2019. COLA also offers two additional, prestigious scholarships that students can apply for now: the [COLA Leadership Scholarship](#) and the [COLA Study Abroad Scholarship](#). These applications are due February 1, 2019. Please encourage your students to take advantage of these wonderful opportunities for support of their education.


