

This week's faculty research profile focuses on **Caroline Hillard**, ART. Her project, entitled *Florence and Etruria: The Etruscan Legacy in the Florentine Renaissance* is related to a book project on the rediscovery of ancient Etruria in Renaissance Florence.



Her appointment as Robert Lehman Fellow at Villa I Tatti, the Harvard University Center for Renaissance Studies in Florence, Italy, allowed her to spend the entirety of her sabbatical year as a member of I Tatti's scholarly community as well as travel to study manuscripts, drawings, and antiquities in cities and archives across Europe. I'm so jealous! Carrie discovered much new material, providing the basis for several substantial articles as well as refocusing her book. The result will be a much richer and more nuanced picture of Renaissance engagement with the Etruscan world.

In preparation for the upcoming Celebration of Research, Scholarship, and Creative Activities, Wright State Libraries are offering two workshops with information about creating academic posters. 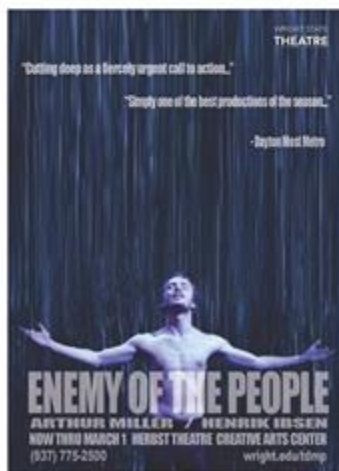
