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French Studies Certificate

This certificate provides in-depth study of French and Francophone Literature, Film, Business, Written and Oral Expression, History, and Phonetics. This certificate is suitable for graduate students wishing to meet requirements to teach French or College Credit Plus courses in the State of Ohio.

This certificate provides currently licensed Ohio teachers the means to obtain the credentials to teach College Credit Plus courses in French in the State of Ohio. The courses are designed to provide rich cultural and literary content in the target language.

Admissions Requirements

- Any degree-seeking WSU graduate student may apply to the program by meeting with the
 certificate advisor. If not a current degree-seeking student, applicants for the graduate
 certificate may apply for the certificate only through the graduate school as a non-degree
 student.
- A supplemental application with a 1-2 page personal statement in French is required.
- Applicants must pass a Modern Languages oral proficiency interview and writing proficiency test with a minimal Intermediate High rating or the equivalent. Currently licensed French teachers may bypass the oral and writing tests.

Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the program, students will be able to:

- demonstrate an advanced understanding of language and literature in French on a global context;
- demonstrate writing and research skills appropriate to professional use and observe ethical practices;
- demonstrate a near-native mastery of the French language, including the ability to write in French at a level appropriate to professional use, and to communicate with native French speakers;
- teach specific works and literary concepts at the advanced high school level, and work as language instructors at the college level.
